What it did not eliminate was common sense, and it did not eliminate courage. This man "schooled" the professors in a way that revealed their shallow understanding of reality.

In our culture, we are often challenged to choose between what our faith clearly reveals, and the denial of some who hold impressive degrees. These realities do not require years of study and research. They only require an open mind, and the courage to stand up for what we see in spite of the critics.
